## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

June 4, 2024

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in the year ended March 31, 2024 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "Mackenzie" and "the Manager" refer to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

### Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks long-term capital growth in U.S. dollars by investing primarily in equities of issuers located anywhere in the world that operate in the environmental economy. The Fund invests primarily in environmental sectors that include clean energy, energy efficiency, clean technology, water, sustainable agriculture and transportation.

### Risk

The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus.

The Fund is suitable for medium- to long-term investors looking for a U.S. dollar-denominated global equity fund that invests in companies that invest in the environmental economy to hold as part of their portfolio, who can handle the volatility of stock markets and who have a medium to high tolerance for risk.

The Fund is not available for purchase under registered plans, but taxable accounts may continue to purchase the Fund.

### Results of Operations

#### Investment Performance

Investment performance is not presented because the Fund has not issued securities for the full 12-month period.

#### Environmental, Social and Governance ("ESG") Impact

The portfolio management team has identified a growing opportunity for environmentally focused investment in large global and integrated utility companies. For that reason, the Fund has holdings in companies whose activities range from renewable energy development to transmission and distribution. Given increasing investments in clean energy relative to fossil fuels globally, the team believes diversified utility companies that invest a significant portion of their capital expenditures in renewable projects are positioned to pursue robust development pathways.

The Fund's holdings include Centrais Elétricas Brasileiras SA – Eletrobras, which is one of the largest utility companies in South America. Eletrobras generates over half of Brazil's electricity supply, almost entirely from hydropower, and operates a significant portion of the country's transmission network. Its operations facilitate not only the effective and efficient transportation of electricity but also the adoption of renewable energy.

### Net Assets

From its inception on October 12, 2023, to March 31, 2024, the Fund experienced US\$0.1 million in net income (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and an increase of US\$1.3 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

### Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the period ended March 31, 2024, is presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

### Recent Developments

The portfolio management team expects interest rate cuts to continue at a slower pace than market expectations because of persistent inflation in developed markets, particularly the United States. Geopolitical issues worsened over the period, in the team's opinion, as the wars in Gaza and Ukraine became more deeply entrenched, and global oil prices increased as a result. However, the team believes developments in the U.S. offshore wind power sector offered some early indications that regulatory-related repricing may allow some developers to restart projects that were cancelled in 2023.

The team takes a value-oriented approach to investing in companies that are positively exposed to the energy transition, in the belief that renewable energy, energy efficiency and other environmentally focused sectors are poised to benefit from growth.

### Related Party Transactions

#### Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to the Manager at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, the Manager pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

#### Other Related Party Transactions

At March 31, 2024, Mackenzie had an investment of US\$1.1 million in the Fund (75.8% of the Fund's NAV). If Mackenzie decides to redeem its investment, it will do so in a manner that reduces the possibility of adverse effects on the Fund.

The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions in the period.

### Past Performance

Past performance is not presented because the Fund has not issued securities for the full 12-month period.

## Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by the Manager to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, and providing other services. The Manager also used the management fees to fund sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

The following dealers affiliated with the Manager may be entitled to distribution-related payments from the Manager on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers: Investors Group Securities Inc. and Investors Group Financial Services Inc.

The Manager used approximately 42% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the period to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 41% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the period. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series. Because the Fund is in its first year, the percentage of management fees used to fund such distribution-related payments is not representative.
